Unleashing the power of the EEF Toolkit

**Delivered by Dr Jo Pearson and Louise Astbury,
Oldham Research School**

Feedback, metacognition and reading have sat at the top of the toolkit as the strategies that have the greatest power to narrow the gaps in attainment for some time; this programme is designed to support school leaders to maximise their impact in school as we emerge from the significant disruption to education over the past three years.



Over the 3 days, delegates will work with expert facilitators from Oldham Research School to develop an understanding of the EEF toolkit and how to unpick the guidance reports. There will be training for leaders in how to understand the evidence and utilise it the most impactful way for their setting. The course will zoom in on the top strands of the toolkit, and the guidance reports that sit behind them. Delegates will be supported to develop policies and undertake effective implementation. Schools will have access to additional wrapround support as they implement change(s) to maximise impact and success.

The course will be a blend of face to face and remote input, with gap tasks to support implementation.

School Staff will be supported to audit their current SEND provision using the Whole School SEND self-evaluation toolkit. A detailed action plan will be created that identifies areas for development. Sessions will then be tailored using EEF Guidance reports to meet individual schools needs through a combination of Train the Trainer and network meetings. Staff will be supported by Specialist Leaders of Education to facilitate whole staff training as well as implement strategies that will transform pedagogy and practice. The programme requires a commitment from each school to identify SEND as a key priority area for development through targeted whole staff development meetings to allow the participants to follow the schedule below.

The programme will be running across the Spring and Summer Term 2023.

Current CPD highlights:

Science subscription package (all phases)

- Bronze, silver, gold and platinum packages available.
 - Gold package example:
 - Completion of needs analysis with science lead in school
 - 2 x days bespoke consultancy time
 - 2 x bespoke twilight (1.5hrs) CPD sessions for all science teachers
 - 2 x places on SLP ran CPD courses
- Upfront cost to schools £2,400 (£1,680 is then paid back to the school through DfE funding after the Needs Analysis has been delivered).

Final cost to school £720

Early Career Teacher support package

- Half termly Early Career Teacher Network
- Annual remote ECT conference

Upfront cost to schools £500 (Eligible for £300 DfE bursary)

Final cost to school £200

Secondary subject leader & subscription package

- Bronze, silver, gold, platinum packages available.
- Silver package example:
 - Termly Science Subject Leader Network meetings
 - 2 x places at SLP run conferences or CPD courses
 - 2 x bespoke CPD sessions for up to 30 staff per session.

Upfront cost to schools £1,500 (Eligible for £1,000 DfE bursary)

Final cost to school £500
