

East Manchester Teaching School Hub Briefing for Headteachers, Principals and Senior Leadership Teams

Supporting your Early Career Teachers and Mentors

As part of our continued improvement and, as we near the end of the first full two-year cycle of our Early Career Framework (ECF) and Appropriate Body (AB) service, we have taken feedback from a range of stakeholders and are responding to this with a revised, streamlined delivery model for the ECF programme that meets the requirements of UCL, the DfE and our schools illustrated below.

Feedback	Actions for 2023-2024		
ECTs find the regularity and timing of the training sessions difficult to manage, and we have seen 60% less engagement with online training sessions.	 In response to this, we are: significantly reducing the number of training sessions across the programme and removing the online component. There will now be five three-hour face-to-face training sessions across the academic year in year one instead of 12; and three two-hour training sessions across the academic year in year two instead of four. 		
Mentors have indicated that they need more clarity on their role and the programme from the start.	To address this, we are: • condensing their termly training sessions into one face-to-face conference at the start of the year.		
Headteachers have raised concerns about the difficulties in releasing ECTs for their training in the first part of the academic year when they need to be establishing relationships and routines with their new pupils.	We fully recognise the importance of this early part of the year and will: • hold our induction conferences in late September; however, ECTs and mentors should engage with the ECF programme from the start of the academic year.		

Our intended changes will alleviate the pressure on you to release ECTs and mentors' multiple times throughout the year, whilst meeting the **DfE requirements for training hours and consequent funding**, which is potentially at risk if ECTs and/or mentors do not fully engage with the programme. However, more importantly, we believe that the opportunity for ECTs and mentors to participate in face-to-face training at our induction conferences will not only provide a valuable opportunity for collaboration between colleagues but a detailed level of clarity that supports their progress and understanding for the rest of the year resulting in **better continued professional development** for both ECTs and mentors and a **significant positive impact on the outcomes of all pupils** in our priority education investment area.

Registering your new Early Career Teachers

Finally, as we approach the busiest recruitment period of the academic year, please remember that if you appoint ECTs (either year one or two) you need to register them with an Appropriate Body and provide an induction based on the Early Career Framework. Your induction tutor will receive an invitation to complete registration on the new DfE digital service – in advance of this, we have been asked to emphasise the below

- schools should not try to set up next year's training programme or register next year's ECTs and mentors until DfE invites them to do so
- schools should check they have nominated their induction tutor ahead of this, or updated their nominated induction tutor if necessary

We will share updated guidance for registering ECTs on the portal once the service is live.

As part of our new delivery model, we will be holding induction conferences for mentors and ECTs (year one and year two) which will also cover the training for the first module of the year. We will also be delivering training for all Induction Tutors in line with our statutory role as an Appropriate Body*. Please find a summary of dates, times, and venue options below.
