MENTORS



What is the Early Career Framework?

The Early Career Framework (ECF) is a fully funded entitlement to a structured twoyear package of high-quality professional development at the start of a teaching career. The ECF is part of the statutory entitlement for Early Career Teachers (ECTs).

The ECF is the evidence base which underpins the training curriculum and entitlement for ECTs. It sets out what they should learn about and learn how to do, during the first two years of their career and builds upon their Initial Teacher Training as part of a spiral curriculum.

What is my role as an ECT mentor?

Your role as a mentor is to engage with and support your ECT as they complete the ECF programme. As a mentor, you will meet with your ECT(s) on a weekly or fortnightly basis; they may also approach you on a more informal basis to ask questions or for day-to-day support.

As part of the ECF programme, you will also engage with developmental training, designed to support you in becoming a highly effective mentor.

You will be assigned to an ECT(s) because of your expertise and experience in the classroom by the school's Induction Tutor. The Induction Tutor is the member of staff responsible for overseeing the legal statutory induction of the ECT: they will observe them formally, meet with them to review their progress, and write their progress reviews and final assessments. You will not be involved in this process.

Your role is to support, nurture, advocate for, and learn with - and from - your ECT(s).

How do I engage with the mentor self-directed studies and mentor sessions?

Mentor Self-directed Studies

- Explore the Mentor SDS materials for the half term before you meet with your ECT.
- \checkmark Listen to the audio version if this is helpful.
- Engage with the activities but select these based on what is most pertinent to your experience and context.
- ✓ Remember to click 'Mark as Done' to register your engagement.

Mentor Sessions

- Access the mentor session through your UCL Extend account and click 'Mark as Done' at the end of the session. You cannot simply use your ECT's account as this won't register your engagement.
- Engage with the activities in the mentor session but select these based on what is most pertinent to your ECT's needs and experience, and your context.
- You can look ahead in the materials to focus on what you think will be most helpful to your ECT i.e., you might want to look ahead to the session about engaging with parents if you have a parents' evening coming up soon.

How do facilitated training sessions work?

Your ECT will attend ONE face-to-face training session per half term. When they have attended this training, please encourage them to discuss this with you in your subsequent mentor session. All ECT training dates can be found on our website <u>here</u>.

As a mentor you will have the opportunity to attend a face-to-face conference in the summer term or in September. This will explore the importance of mentoring, how to engage with the programme, and how to be an effective mentor. It's also a great opportunity to collaborate and network with other colleagues. We also host an online training session later in the year. Details about both events will be shared as applicable by EMTSH. If you are unable to attend one of these events, you will need to watch a UCL recording of the session within three weeks to register your engagement.

What do I do if I have already completed the ECF programme?

If you have completed the ECF programme, you no longer need to complete the mentor self-directed studies or attend training sessions. You will still have access to UCL Extend so you can use the mentor session materials with your ECT. If your circumstances are more complex, please contact us.
